HOW TO SHOP IT

For the coat, choose a bold colour - a beautifully cut Prada will last for years. - the Jimmy Choo 'Agnes' has the perfect heel height. A bag that you use every day represents a big spend, but the cost-per-wear is low. For work, start with one amazing dress - it becomes a focal point for your whole office wardrobe.'
